*The Supporting Victorian Sport and Recreation Program (SVSR) is a new Victorian Government initiative that provides grants to assist state sporting associations and state sport and recreation bodies to deliver initiatives that align to the Victorian Government's priority of increasing participation in sport and active recreation by:*

- *Building a more sustainable sport and recreation sector in Victoria.*
- *Increasing the equity, diversity and inclusiveness of the sport and recreation industry in Victoria.*

*The Access for All Abilities program facilitated increased participation in sport and active recreation for people with a disability by:*

- *Building capacity of sport and recreation organisations to provide sustainable opportunities in sport and recreation for people with a disability.*
- *Fostering and developing partnerships and networks to enhance equity of access and inclusion in the sport and recreation sector.*
- *Promoting awareness of the availability and benefits of active participation.*
- *Influencing the planning and development of accessible and inclusive sport and recreation environments, policies and strategies.*
